



BYOD Policy and Guidelines

INTRODUCTION

Kurunjang Secondary College promotes the use of digital learning technologies including software and the use of devices to help students become digitally literate and enhance teaching and learning.

RATIONALE

Through increased access to digital technologies, students can benefit from enhanced learning that is interactive, collaborative, personalised, and engaging. Digital technologies enable our students to interact with and create high quality content, resources and tools. It also enables customised learning tailored to students' particular needs and interests and transforms assessment, reporting and feedback, driving new forms of collaboration and communication.

PURPOSE

To ensure that all students and members of our school community understand:

- (a) our commitment to providing students with the opportunity to benefit from digital technologies to support and enhance learning and development at Kurunjang Secondary College [including our 1-to-1 Bring Your Own Device Program]
- (b) expected student behaviour when using digital technologies including the internet, social media, and digital devices (including computers, laptops, tablets)
- (c) the College's commitment to promoting safe, responsible and discerning use of digital technologies, and educating students on appropriate responses to any dangers or threats to wellbeing that they may encounter when using the internet and digital technologies
- (d) our College's policies and procedures for responding to inappropriate student behaviour on digital technologies and the internet

DEFINITIONS

- (e) For the purpose of this policy, "digital technologies" are defined as being any networks, systems, software or hardware including electronic devices and applications which allow a user to access, receive, view, record, store, communicate, copy or send any information such as text, images, audio, or video.

Safe and appropriate use of digital technologies

Digital technology, if not used appropriately, may present risks to users' safety or wellbeing. At Kurunjang Secondary College, we are committed to educating all students to be safe, responsible and discerning in the use of digital technologies, equipping them with skills and knowledge to navigate the digital age.

At Kurunjang Secondary College we:

- use online sites and digital tools that support students' learning, and focus our use of digital technologies on being learning-centred

- restrict the use of digital technologies in the classroom to specific uses with targeted educational or developmental aims
- supervise and support students using digital technologies in the classroom
- effectively and responsively address any issues or incidents that have the potential to impact on the wellbeing of our students
- have programs in place to educate our students to be promoting safe, responsible and discerning use of digital technologies,
- educate our students about digital issues such as online privacy, intellectual property and copyright, and the importance of maintaining their own privacy online
- actively educate and remind students of our Bullying Prevention Policy, Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy, and the College's Agreed Behaviours, and our College values of Respect, Achievement, and Responsibility including online behaviours
- have an Acceptable Use Agreement outlining the expectations of students when using digital technology at school
- use clear protocols and procedures to protect students working in online spaces, which includes reviewing the safety and appropriateness of online tools and communities, removing offensive content at earliest opportunity
- educate our students on appropriate responses to any dangers or threats to wellbeing that they may encounter when using the internet and other digital technologies
- provide a filtered internet service to block access to inappropriate content
- refer suspected illegal online acts to the relevant law enforcement authority for investigation
- support parents and carers to understand safe and responsible use of digital technologies and the strategies that can be implemented at home through regular updates in our newsletter and annual information sheets.

Distribution of school owned devices to students and personal student use of digital technologies at the College will only be permitted where students and their parents/carers have completed a signed Acceptable Use Agreement.

It is the responsibility of all students to protect their own password and not divulge it to another person. If a student or staff member knows or suspects an account has been used by another person, the account holder must notify their classroom teacher and/or House Leader, Coordinator as appropriate, immediately.

All messages created, sent or retrieved on the College's network are the property of the College. The College reserves the right to access and monitor all messages and files on the computer system, as necessary and appropriate. Communications including text and images may be required to be disclosed to law enforcement and other third parties without the consent of the sender.

School Provision

Kurunjang Secondary College uses the internet and digital technologies as teaching and learning tools. We see the internet and digital technologies as valuable resources and as such strive to increase the prevalence of devices at the College. The Kurunjang Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Program can enhance and enrich learning opportunities both at school and at home.

At Kurunjang Secondary College the BYOD will be underpinned by the Acceptable Usage Policy, and Mobile Phone and Related Devices Policy. Where any conflicts occur, these policies will take precedence.

- Students are responsible for the care and maintenance of their devices including data protection and battery charging.
- The Department and College will not accept any liability for the theft, damage or loss of any student's device.
- Students who bring their own devices onto College sites do so at their own risk. The College is not obliged to provide hardware or technical support for devices.
- Students who bring their own device understand that in order for their device to gain access to the Kurunjang Secondary College network will be imaged (installation of the Department owned operating system and software package)
- **Students understand that imaging will result in:**
 - **The wiping of the Hard Drive therefore all student material will need to be backed up.**
 - **Limited access to Admin rights on their device (similar to a College PC).**
 - **Upon leaving the College, that Department issues operating system and software package will expire and any new operating system and software package will be at student, parent or carer cost.**
- Students and their parents/carers must complete and return a signed BYOD Agreement prior to connecting to the College's network. See **Appendix 1**.

Guidelines and Requirements to participate in the BYOD

- Devices must be Windows 10 capable
- Devices should have a reasonable battery life and must be charged at the start of the day
- At Kurunjang we are a PC school and as such we prefer PC devices however Mac devices will also be considered (with the exception of Ipads which will not be accepted)
- Chromebooks and Android will not be accepted

Student BYOD Agreement

It is important to ensure that students are aware of and agree to their obligations under the Student Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Policy and relevant policies.

Student Responsibilities

Students are solely responsible for the care and maintenance of their BYO devices. This includes but is not limited to:

- Students must ensure that their device is fully charged before bringing them to school. Students are responsible for managing the battery life of their device and acknowledge that the College is not responsible for charging their device. The IT department do not keep chargers for students to use or borrow.
- That students have a working understanding of their device and how to use it effectively. It is not the responsibility of classroom teachers or College Technical Support Staff to teach students how to use their devices.
- Labelling their device for identification purposes (identification labels should not be easily removable).
- Purchasing and using device protective casing.
- Ensuring the device is safe and secure during travel to and from the College and throughout the school day.
- Possibly taking insurance coverage of their own device to protect any accidental damage, theft or loss.

Implementation of Policy

- The College will provide a filtered internet service (While at school, students are to use the College network which will be restricted by the DET filtered internet service. All social media sites, and inappropriate sites, are blocked while students are at school).
- The College will provide supervision and direction in all use of electronic devices when using the internet.
- The College will provide support to parents to understand this policy and agreement (languages other than English).
- The use of devices during class time is not permitted unless stated by a teacher (Class time is defined as any time between 9.00 am and 3.10 pm not including recess and lunch).
- Student use of the internet on the College's network will only be permitted where students and their parents/carers provide written acknowledgment that students agree to act in accordance with the standards of conduct established in this policy.
- All messages created, sent or retrieved on the College's network are the property of the College, and should be considered public information. The College reserves the right to access and monitor all messages and files on the system as deemed necessary. Internet messages are public communication and are not private. All communications including texts and images can be disclosed to law enforcement and other third parties.

Breach of this Policy

All breaches of this policy will be investigated by the leadership team of the College and may result in the ban/removal (or any other consequences) from the College network/facilities and possible withdrawal of the device from the BYOD. Some possible examples of breaches include but not limited to:

- Accessing inappropriate websites can result in restricted internet use and/or removal from the College network, pending investigation by the College
- Storing of inappropriate images, videos, games, etc.
- Storing / Modifying files on the College Network (other than personal user space) (i.e. creating folders to store games etc.)
- Cyber bullying

BYOD Acceptable Use Agreement
