RE: TERM 4 ARRANGEMENTS- STAGED RETURN TO ONSITE LEARNING

Dear families,

This afternoon I received the following information from the Department of Education and Training confirming the staged return to onsite learning in Term 4 for our students.

The Victorian Government has announced the Roadmap to Deliver the National Plan.

The Roadmap, which is based on advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer, sets out the staged return to onsite learning in Term 4, with the plan being that all students return onsite by Friday 5 November as follows:

For our school, this means that the following arrangements will be in place:

| 8 & 9 | From Tuesday 26 October | Tuesday & Wednesday |

| 11 | From Tuesday 26 October | 5 days a week |

Remote and flexible learning will be delivered to students on the days they are not onsite.

Vulnerable children and children of parents or guardians who are on the authorised provider and authorised worker list can continue attending onsite as before. If you fall in these categories please contact Aylin Gokmen, the College's Assistant Principal, to confirm your child's attendance onsite. This will allow us to put appropriate arrangements in place.
