COVID-19 Learning From Home

This webpage will provide our families with information, updates and advice on the College's response to Coronavirus and the arrangements in place for Learning from Home.

Learning from Home Guidelines

All students who can learn from home must learn from home. This is a very clear directive by the Victorian Government based on the advice of the Chief Health Officer. The only exception to this rule will be when parents and carers are unable to provide care or are unable to make other care arrangements for their children because they are deemed essential workers who cannot work from home. If you fall into the category deemed essential please contact the College to discuss arrangements for your child's attendance at school.

Accessing Student Work

All student work will be placed on Compass, a short video has been prepared to guide students how to locate their classwork.

If your child does not have access to a device at home please contact the College.

As a result of your responses already received we have already (or are in the process) of helping all students from year 9 to 12 by loaning them a laptop which the college already has. Unfortunately, at the moment we do not have enough laptops for our Year 7 and 8 students who have requested one. We are now awaiting laptops/internet that the Department of Education and Training (DET), and the Premier, have announced as part of the additional resources to those who require support. As of yet, unfortunately these have not arrived, and we are unsure as to when they will arrive. We do not have a solution as yet for those with no internet, as we await internet dongles to arrive from the DET that will solve this problem.

At this stage our intention is to support those students in Year 7 & 8 with no device/internet and Year 9 to 12 without internet, by providing paper hard copies through the mail of the work given by teachers.

Purchasing a Device & BYOD

The College currently operates an optional BYOD program for Years 7 & 8 students. The recommended device for our BYOD program is a Microsoft Surface Go 64gb. Students who own a Surface Go will be provided with Windows 10 Enterprise, Microsoft Office 2019 over 30 software titles and links to various technologies used in classes.

If you are currently considering purchasing your child their own device to use during the Learning from Home period the College recommends to purchase the Microsoft Surface Go. When you have purchased a device please contact the College to arrange to have our College's IT staff load the required software onto it.

Accessing School Software & Programs

Compass

The College currently operates Compass software which has an integrated parent portal, this portal enables parents to:

- Access your child's Student Semester Reports
- Access your child's testing results
- Communicate with your teachers
- Book your Parent/Student/Teacher conferences
- View up-to-date class and school attendance information
- Approve or enter upcoming or past absences for your son/daughter
- Update your registered email and mobile number (used for SMS alerts) details
- Access information regarding upcoming events and news

Passwords



Students will require their own login for Compass to access the student portal. This is accessed with their student code and student code password which they currently use at school. This will take you straight to the outlook email account


Contacting College Staff



Parents Emailing Through Compass

Parents have a link on their Compass homepage that allows them to quickly email all the teachers for each of their students.




Clicking this link will open the 'Send Email' screen. As you can see in the image below parents do not have the option to mask their email address when sending emails. In the Recipients list each teacher's name is displayed, as well as which class they teach the student. Please keep in mind that only the lead teacher for each class will show up in this list. Parents can however use the 'Add Recipient' button at the top to select any other staff members that may be relevant for their communication.



Students Emailing Through Compass

Students do not have a button to email all their teachers the way parents do. Students can email their teachers by going to the class page and clicking the 'Email Teacher' link under the teacher's name.



Other Software and Programs

Important Information- Before student scan access Office 365 they need to have an edupass account.

EduPass

Edupass is a unique identity provided to each student giving access to the departments applications and platforms such as Office 365, Style, ClickView etc.

To use these programs the students must enter their unique ID in the format of xxxxx@schools.vic.edu.au and then the password. XXXXX being the username that has been provided by the school.

Microsoft Office 365

Office 365 is an integrated experience of apps and services, designed to help students pursue their education. Programs like Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Teams and more, are updated monthly with the latest features and security updates.

It will allow students to collaborate in Microsoft Teams, the new hub for teamwork where you can chat, organize meetings, and share files.

Students will also be able to save files to OneDrive with one terabyte of online storage, allowing access across devices and on the go.

Structure of a School Day when Learning From Home

- Arrange an appropriate workspace, with a comfortable chair, and plenty of light.
- Ensure your textbooks, and other materials are ready and at hand.
- Your workspace should be in a common area where appropriate adult supervision is available.
- Make sure your computer or tablet is charged.
- Make sure you have any hard copies of tasks if you do not have access to the internet or computer.
- Do not use a bedroom as a workspace if possible.
- Ensure that you dress appropriately for the day. Neat, casual clothing should be worn to establish a 'normal' school routine.
- Keep to your scheduled timetable as best as possible.
- Check Compass, and appropriate email address daily for classwork.
- Set daily goals and create a timetable for time spent on tasks.
- Communicate with your teachers. Let them know what supports you need, and ask questions to clarify your understanding. Seek feedback.

Stick to the No Mobile Phone Policy during these times so you are not easily distracted.

Upload or submit work as requested by your teachers. Ask for help from your family members or teachers if you are unsure how to do this. If you're working from hard copies, try to drop off your work at the General Office by the due dates.
